




MEMBER OF THE MONTH Irena Swanson

Irena Swanson saw quilts for the first time when she was a high-school exchange student in Tooele, Utah, from then-Yugoslavia. With all the help from her host family, she made her first quilt, and that quilt has been much used and loved. She resumed quilting in the early 1990s after her third year or graduate school at Purdue, and joined the West Lafayette quilt guild. She then moved away for 28 years for jobs as a mathematics professor. She uses mathematics to plan the making of quilt tops fast, accurately, with fewer seams. A new job lured her back to Purdue in 2020. She was not going to join the guild for fear of being too busy, but Brenda Weiner and Gwen Wallace roped her in in her first month in town. The Old Tippecanoe Quilt Guild community was the friendliest back in the 1990s and again now, thirty years later. Thank you to all!

Irena's main streamlined method is tube piecing for making all-over and rows and blocks of triangles and parallelograms, but she also uses enhanced strip piecing for making four-patch, nine-patch, log cabin, courthouse steps blocks. She has a YouTube channel irenaswanson2075 with many instructional videos, Instagram account Irena Swanson, Facebook account Tube Piecing, and a website <u>tubepiecing.com</u>.

2024 Quilt Challenge

All Creatures Big and Small

Each OTQG Member is eligible to enter one quilt for the challenge.

Any technique can be used such as piecework, applique, photo transfer, embroidery, collage, etc. Your imagination is your guide.

Quilt must have 3 layers held together with quilting or tying. (backing, batting, top) Quilt should have a finished edge: either a binding or a facing.

Quilt should have a maximum size of 24 x 24 inches. Quilts can be smaller but no less than 12 x 12 inches. At this time the quilt does not need a sleeve for hanging but will need a label on the back.
