MEMBER OF THE MONTH Vicki Schmidt

Vicki has been a member of the Old Tippecanoe Quilt Guilt since 2014 when she retired from teaching. She taught for 42 years with all but one year in Tippecanoe County in the field of music. She tried hand quilting in 1982 but found that with teaching and family there was no time to quilt. She decided that when she retired, she would start her quilting. Instead, she continued to knit, cross stitch and was a basket weaver. Much easier to drop and go projects. Her mother and her ancestors were quilters but somehow it was lost on the next generation due to 2 income families working. Vicki wishes she could have accessed her mother's knowledge. Her mother and 4 sisters would sit around a quilting frame and hand quilt their quilts.

Vicki received her first longarm within two years of retiring from a generous lady who did not want her machine. It was free as long as it was used and with some quilting going to charity. All she had to do was to go get it and set it up in her own home. The love of creating quilt tops has become a passion as well as the quilting for charities.

2024 Quilt Challenge

All Creatures Big and Small

Each OTQG Member is eligible to enter one quilt for the challenge.

Any technique can be used such as piecework, applique, photo transfer, embroidery, collage, etc. Your imagination is your guide.

Quilt must have 3 layers held together with quilting or tying. (backing, batting, top) Quilt should have a finished edge: either a binding or a facing.

Quilt should have a maximum size of 24 x 24 inches. Quilts can be smaller but no less than 12 x 12 inches. At this time the quilt does not need a sleeve for hanging but will need a label on the back.

April 2 - May 4 | Total Eclipse of the Quilt


